■ Andrew Taylor of Newtown, a junior at the Science Horizons School in Danbury, was one of two Connecticut students awarded a \$20,000 scholarship to Quinnipiac University at the Connecticut Science Fair for his project, "Comparing Salt Marshes on the Long Island Sound Using Health Indices in Fundulus Helichroous." The Connecticut Science Fair was held at Quinnipiac University, Hamden, in March. If he's admitted and enrolls at Quinnipiac, Taylor will receive a \$5,000 annual scholarship toward tuition for four years to attend as an undergraduate. Taylor's project has received previous science
